



National Allied Golf Associations Update – May 17, 2021

The Province of Manitoba has confirmed that within the current [Public Health Order \(May 12, 2021\)](#), all persons engaged in an outdoor sporting or recreational activity must maintain a separation of at least two metres from other participants (Order 13 (5)). This includes golf carts when used by patrons not from the same household. If an appropriate barrier is in place, such as a plastic shield between the driver and the passenger, two people from separate households can share a golf cart.
