





HANDICAP & COURSE

RATING

The Course Rating Team rated 12 courses this year and completed a total of 65 tees rated, 40 men's tees and 25 women's tees.

To maintain valid course and slope ratings, golf courses are required to be re-rated at least every 10 years or when significant changes are made.

Courses rated this year included Oakview Golf & Country Club Inc. in Gretna, Deloraine Golf Club, MacGregor Town & Country Club, Carman Golf & Curling Club, Whispering Winds of Warren Golf Club, Netley Creek Golf Course, Minnedosa Golf & Country Club, Rossmere Country Club in Winnipeg, Wheat City Golf Course in Brandon, Kitchen Creek Golf Club in Fort Frances, ON, Niakwa Country Club in Winnipeg and Rivers Edge Golf Course in Beausejour, MB.

We had our experienced raters participate in a Golf Saskatchewan two-day virtual training session and also presented a Golf Canada live training session to new raters this year.

The World Handicap System was implemented in 2020 and Golf Manitoba held a number of virtual seminars around the province on the new system. We encourage all clubs to participate as the license agreement with the USGA requires that each club have at least one representative be certified. These representatives will then be a resource for inquiries at the club level. If your club has not certified an individual, please do so, and if you have already sent someone, we would encourage you to send others to be educated on the details of the handicap system. We would also encourage clubs to organize seminars specifically for your members and Golf Manitoba will come to your club to assist.

Thank you to all our rating volunteers for their efforts throughout the year. We are looking forward to another busy summer next year for all our rating teams, and will continue to provide our member golfers with educational seminars on the parameters of the handicap system.

We recruited 2 new raters at the end of this rating year and look forward to their participation in 2023. We continue to search for more people that would be interested in joining our rating team.

MEMBERSHIP

Sue Wright-Cassan

In 2022, the effects of the Covid pandemic continued to linger. Continued masking and a reluctance by some to gather in a group are examples. Having said that, golf continued as a safe and expanding activity.

Total individual membership increased by 4.4% across our 84 facilities or leagues with all of the growth in the adult category. Our junior and public player membership categories little change over 2021.

Three new clubs joined Golf Manitoba in 2022: Poplar Ridge Golf Course, Southport Golf Club and Virden Wellview Golf Course. We want to thank them for joining us and extend a warm welcome to our golf family!

For the year we had 84 member clubs and leagues (see page 28 for the 2022 directory of our member clubs and leagues). It has been a challenging golf season and we sincerely thank our member clubs for their continued support.

From a golf services perspective, 2022 has been quite positive. As of September 30, Golf Canada reported 8.4 million rounds posted to the Score Centre and is on target for 9 million rounds. This is just short of the all-time record of 9.265 million posted in 2021. Here in Manitoba, that trend continued with 220k thousand rounds posted by mid-October against the 260k posted for all of 2021. The primary reason for this forty-thousand round decrease is weather related and due to the late start of the 2022 season where we lost 30k rounds in April and May alone. Score posting is still much higher over the past three years averageing 234k rounds per year in since 2020. Members are contining to use the Golf Canada App with over 100k rounds posted in 2022 representing over 45% of all scores posted in Manitoba.

The incident protection program also yielded a record 30 claims in Manitoba paying back \$23,343 to members for equipment protection, window protection and accident protection.

We were also pleased to issue 78 Hole-in-One certificates to those members who made their "Shot of a Lifetime" this season. Congratulations on this exciting golfing accomplishment!

As we move into 2023, efforts will remain focused on educating our member clubs about the benefits of membership. Additionally, we will focus our member education on the Rules of Golf and the World Handicap System that came on-line in January of 2020.

If you are wanting to learn more about the World Handicap System, learning resources are available on our website at golfmb.ca/handicapping.

As the season comes to a close here in Manitoba and for most of Canada, a reminder that member benefits extend for 365 days from enrollment and include the following:

- An Official Golf Canada Handicap Index under the World Handicap System
- Up to \$6,000 in Incident Protection Coverage
- Member exclusive offers and discounts through Avis, Hilton, Manitoba Blue Cross, Nott Autocorp, Sport Manitoba, Level Wear as well as with Golf Canada gear and event tickets
- · Membership dues are reinvested into Grow the Game programs

With the covid restrictions muted, the golf season was extremely vibrant. Our referees responded in a fantastic fashion and filled all the required slots for every event. Between May 28th and August 26th, our group of referees worked 16 different championships which works out to 10 different Manitoba events as some have been combined to make the process more efficient. Unique events such as the All-Abilities Championship combined with the Women's City & District Championship and the Junior Bantam Championship made for a wide variety of abilities and rules. The revamped Senior Men's event was of particular interest. It is now a Four Ball event and was held at Oak Island near Virden. This course is a real gem. At least 2 golfers from different clubs expressed to me a desire to bring groups from their clubs to play later in the year. This is the kind of thing that membership in Golf Manitoba does for a rural club.

While we still rely heavily on our more experienced group, it is heartening to see our ranks being supplemented by young, enthusiastic people. We presently have 23 referees that are rated level 2 or 3. Of these 11 are recent recruits who are working regularly at our tournaments. We have 11 level 3 officials and 4 have just finished or are finishing the required hours of apprenticeship. I think in the next few years the focus of our committee should be to add more females as they make up only 6 of our 23 referees.

This year our committee consisted of Rob Bell, D'Arcy Lachance, Gord Hudson, Don MacDonald, Carol Martel, and me. They all put in many hours during the year and should be commended for their dedication. Don MacDonald, the Manitoba representative on the Canadian rules committee, was the head official in the two Golf Canada events held in our province this year. The Canadian Women's Mid-Amateur & Senior Championship held at Breeze Bend and the NextGen Prairie Championship, were marque events for our referees. The host clubs did a bang-up job and at Breeze Bend the number of volunteers was enormous. Our refereeing group handled both these events with their usual high level of Professionalism.

An unusual aside is the people administrating events for Golf Canada has changed this year and there were some minor difficulties that illustrated how well our tournament staff do their jobs. A special thanks to Seth, Danial, Amy, and their intrepid leader Lisa who provided their usual fabulous assistance with the tournaments. It such a treat to arrive at a venue knowing that all one must do is referee as everything else has or will be handled in a professional manner.

Golf in Schools

This year saw the Golf In Schools program make a return after a 2 year absence due to Covid restrictions. An upgrade in equipment made it possible for Golf In Schools to be offered to older students at the secondary level. A total of 38 clinics were conducted in the spring and fall, 12 rural schools and 26 schools within the perimeter. Throughout the 38 clinics a total of 6,862 students participated (3,447 males and 3,415 females).

Junior Mobile Clinics

Both juniors and adults were able to participate in our Mobile Clinics this year. 15 Mobile Clinics were conducted in rural locations across Manitoba, everywhere from Oak Island to Rivers Edge Golf Course in Beausejour. Throughout the 15 clinics we saw 480 participants (178 Female, 288 Male and 14 Adults).

Junior Skills Challenge

The 2022 Provincial Championship was held on July 17th at the Southwood Golf and Country Club where 32 young golfers ranging in ages from 5-18 registered and participated in both Female and Male categories of under 8,9-11,12-14, and 15-18. Many of these young golfers were competing for the very first time.

Junior Player Development Teams

Junior Girls: This year's team consisted of 15 young athletes, 6 from rural Manitoba and 9 from greater Winnipeg ranging in ages from 11-18 years and under the coaching of Head Coach Bri-ann Tokariwski. Some of the hi-lights of their season were:

- · Bi/weekly, team practices and workouts at Sport Manitoba
- Monthly sessions with team Manitoba Sport psychologist, Paige Zaporzan
- Four team members plus the coach attended the Golf Canada training facility at Bear Mountain, Victoria BC, in late March.
- Participated in the Women's Nassau League finishing 4th.
- The team members competed in many provincial and club events.

Notable results are as follows:

TOURNAMENT

Ken Warwick

We held 16 events and one qualifier in 2022. A new and exciting addition to our event calendar was the All Abilities Championship, a first for our association. We also saw the return of inter-provincial team competition at all Golf Canada national champoinships after a two-year absence due to COVID-19.

All events were held without any weather disruptions or delays. We had a total 1,695 competitive rounds played and 864 participants in 2022 against 1,767 rounds and 875 participants in 2021. 2022 tournament revenues are projected to exceed budget slightly at just over \$147K against expenses of \$148K.

Some notable season highlights:

- The 100th Junior Boys Championship was played at the St.
 Charles Country Club in July with Braxton Kuntz winning for a second straight year. He also set a course record of 8-under par 64 in the final round on the West-South Course.
- Braxton Kuntz also won the 2022 Nott Autocorp Men's Amateur Championship again for a second straight year. With the win, Braxton became the first male golfer in Manitoba golf history to win both the junior and the amateur in consecutive years.
- We welcomed St. Vital Dental Centre as the title sponsor of the Match Play Championship.
- Manitoba Blue Cross joined Golf Manitoba as the official Health & Wellness Partner of the association providing our athletes with water, engergy drinks and bars at all championships.
- There were 19 top-25 finishes in national championships by Manitoba golfers including one national championship win (Curtis Markusson of St. Charles Country Club won the Canadian Mid-Masters).
- We had 66 volunteers supporting our championships in 2022 adding up to 166 days and 1,200 hours of input.
- Breezy Bend Country Club hosted the 2022 Canadian Women's Mid-Amatuer & Senior Championship in late August.

Of considerable note was subsidizing junior event entry fees by 50% in 2022. A total of \$15,000 was also made available to juniors who qualified for national level compeition to assist with travel costs. Both of these supports were again made possible by the generous committment of the Alex & Peggy Colonello Foundation that continues to work with Golf Manitoba to support the development of junior golf in the province.

REPORT OF THE

TREASURER

Kathy Turner

Each year Golf Manitoba strikes an operating budget using best estimates for the delivery of its programs and services within projected funding and revenue limits. The Executive Director, along with the Golf Manitoba team and with oversight from the Board of Directors manages the operations guided by the budget adopted.

Excess of Revenue over Expenses

For fiscal year ended March 31, 2022, the Board of Directors had budgeted for an excess of Revenue over Expenses of \$16,249.

The accompanying audited financial statements of Golf Manitoba Inc. for the year ended March 31, 2022 report an excess of Revenue over Expenses of \$134,729. Without the measures discussed below this excess would have been \$33,106, as compared to the previous year ended March 31, 2021 where there was an excess of \$199,947.

The Board had undertaken the following actions:

- Golf Manitoba applied for the Federal Sport Emergency Funding in 2020/21 to which some of the income was recognized in 2021/22;
- Golf Manitoba had applied for the Canadian Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) program for 2020/21 and this program was continued for 2021/22; and,
- Golf Manitoba had applied for a Canada Emergency Business Account loan of \$40,000 in 2020/21. An additional \$20,000 was available which Golf Manitoba applied for in 2021/22. Repayment of this loan will be made in December 2022 to which \$20,000 is forgiven.

As a result the excess of Revenue over Expenses was largely due to the following contributing factors:

Revenues - Issues of Note

Revenues from operations for the year (excluding the subsidies and grants discussed above) were \$200,213 more than in the prior year. The largest differences were in the following areas:

- Larger contribution from the Colonello Foundation along with carryover from 2020-21.
- Added three new coporate and event partners.
- The Women's Amatuer & Men's Mid-Amateur was sold out including a qualifer.
- · Nine new facilities joined.
- Junior development teams resumed training which generated the increase in Camp Fees. This also includes income for entry to the Team Manitoba spring training camp held in Victoria, BC.

Expenses - Issues of Note

Overall expenses from operations for the year were also up \$194,027 more than in the previous fiscal year.

- Wages were re-allocated to different categories as most programs resumed operations.
- Tournament expenses increased with all events running at at larger than budgeted attendance. A qualifier was also held that was previously not budgeted for.
- We resumed mobile clinics in 2021. Junior development teams resumed training that also included a spring training camp in Victoria, BC.
- Although interprovincial team competitions were not held in 2021, Golf Manitoba provided travel support to those
 players that qualified for nationals in team positions i.e. top 3 for each major championship. Junior players received
 collectively \$15,000 in travel support from the Colonello Foundation.

As was in 2020/21, the defining characteristic of the 2021/22 fiscal year for Golf Manitoba was the ongoing uncertainty surrounding the operations of the organization. Financial accountability remains a priority for Golf Manitoba, and dispite the challenges we faced in 2021/22, I am encouraged with the operating results outlined in our enclosed Financial Statements. I would like to commend my fellow board members and the entire team at Golf Manitoba for their diligent efforts in helping to navigate the associaiton to another successful year.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund's mandate is to provide scholarships to student golfers for the advancement of their education at a Canadian post-secondary educational institution through the receipt, investment, accumulation, and disbursement of funds for that purpose. Scholarships are awarded to golfers who submit applications which meet established criteria for academic achievement, community involvement and golfing ability. Since 1986, the Scholarship Fund has awarded over 200 scholarships, totaling more than \$230,000 to student golfers throughout Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario.

In 2022, the Scholarship Fund continued its plan of transitioning the fixed assets of the original trust fund from commercial financial institutions to The Winnipeg Foundation. The completion of transition of assets is expected to occur in late 2022. The Scholarship Fund has already benefited significantly from this process in the form of matching funds and increasing yield on the financial assets held with The Winnipeg Foundation. This has allowed for an increased number and value of scholarships being able to be awarded -- in 2022, 11 scholarships totaling \$16,500 was available for disbursement.

The Scholarship Fund has a number of scholarships named in honour of individuals that have specific criteria. In addition, there are several Golf Manitoba general awards available:

- The Dr. Dwight Parkinson scholarship is awarded to the secondary school graduate with the highest academic achievement who will be pursuing a post-secondary education.
 The scholarship was established on a perpetual basis from a generous donation received from Mr. David Hill.
- The Brian Gilhuly Memorial Award is presented to a candidate demonstrating superior scholastic achievement who is continuing their academic career. This scholarship was funded on a perpetual basis due to a generous endowment from Brian Gilhuly's estate.
- The Craig Yahiro Memorial Scholarship is two awards, one to a woman and one to a man, who are entering or continuing with post-secondary studies and who are either Golf Manitoba members or who are currently involved with golf either through employment or participation. This scholarship is funded through the generosity of the Yahiro Family and an annual fundraising event held at Rossmere Country Club.





2021 MALE & FEMALE AMATEUR GOLFERS OF THE YEAR

BOBBI UHL & BRAXTON KUNTZ

On behalf of selection committee members Clayton Dreger, Jill Hardy, Adam Speirs and Ken Wiebe, Golf Manitoba is pleased to announce the 2021 Female and Male Amateur Golfer of the Year Award winners.

Bobbi Uhl of Shilo Country Club is the Female Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Uhl had a flawless 2021 provincial competitive season. She started with a win at the Women's City & District Championship, her first ever title in the event and carried that momentum going on to capture the Diamond Athletic Women's Amateur Championship. It was the first provincial women's amateur title for Uhl and her second straight tournament victory. With the amateur win, Uhl has now won every single Golf Manitoba major women's event including the Junior Girls, City & District, Match Play and Amateur championships.

Having won this award in 2020, the 21 year old follows in the footsteps of 2018 and 2019



winner Rhonda Orr.

Uhl is currently in her senior year at Longwood University majoring in Athletic Training.

Braxton Kuntz of Breezy Bend Country Club is the Male Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Kuntz was a perfect 2-0 in provincial competition in 2021. He led wire-to-wire at the Junior Boys Championship shooting a three-day total of 219, good for a three-shot victory. The 18 year old carried the momentum from his first junior boys title into the Nott Autocorp Amateur Championship where he posted an impressive 16-under par total winning his first men's amateur title.

With the win, Kuntz set a new Men's Amateur scoring record in relation to par and becomes only the fourth golfer in Manitoba golf history to win both the junior boys and the men's amateur championships in the same year joining Todd Fanning, Rob McMillan and Mike Keast, who also accomplished the feat.

Kuntz is currently in his first year at Nicholls State University majoring in Finance.

Of note, due to the ongoing challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic, the 2021 Golf Manitoba Awards event was held virtually

on November 18, 2021. Over 750 people have viewed the recorded event that was uploaded to the official Golf Manitoba YouTube page.

About the Golf Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year Award – The Manitoba Amateur Golfer of the Year award recognizes outstanding performance by Manitoba golfers in all levels of competition with the first award presented in 1975. In 2015, the award was re-established to include both a female and male category.

The Committee also considers, for review and approval by the Board, the engagement or re-appointment of the external auditors.

Opinion

Notes to Financial Statements Year Ended March 31, 2022

1. DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Golf Manitoba Inc. (the "organization") is a non-profit organization established to develop, promote, govern and service the game of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario for the benefit of all participants.

The organization is exempt from taxation as a non-profit entity under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Because a precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent upon future events, the preparation of financial statements for a period necessarily involves the use of estimates which have been made using careful judgement. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within the reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the significant accounting policies summarized below:

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value when acquired or issued. In subsequent periods, financial assets with actively traded markets are reported at fair value, with any unrealized gains and losses reported in income. All other financial instruments are reported at amortized cost, and tested for impairment at each reporting date. Transaction costs on the acquisition, sale, or issue of financial instruments are expensed when incurred.

Investments

Investments, which consist of guaranteed investment certificates with original maturities at date of purchase beyond three months, are carried at amortized cost.

Inventory

Inventory is recorded at cost and consists of rule books, pins, scorecards and clothing.

Capital assets

Capital assets are stated at cost or deemed cost less accumulated amortization. Capital assets are amortized over their estimated useful lives on a straight-line basis at the following rates:

Computer software4 yearsOffice equipment3 to 4 yearsTournament equipment10 yearsOffice furniture3 to 5 years

The organization regularly reviews its capital assets to eliminate obsolete items.

Capital assets acquired during the year but not placed into use are not amortized until they are placed into use.

The Golf Studio capital asset addition shown in Note 4 was not in use by March 31, 2022, therefore no amortization expense was recorded in the year ended March 31, 2022.

Deferred capital contributions

Deferred capital contributions represent contributions received which are restricted for the purchase of capital assets. The deferred amounts are recognized into revenue at the same rate of amortization as the related acquired capital assets.

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for contributions. Externally restricted contributions are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized. Unrestricted contributions are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donated services

A large number of volunteers donate significant amounts of their time to program events and fundraising activities. No amount has been reflected in the financial statements for donated services since an objective basis is not available to measure the value of such services.

Allocation of salaries and wages and office expenses

The organization allocates salary and wage, and office expenses to three functional areas: administration, program management and tournament. The percentages are based upon estimates of staff time and resources spent for each area. These percentages are reviewed every year to determine whether there has been any significant shift which might warrant a change to the allocations.

FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments and has a comprehensive risk management framework to monitor, evaluate and manage these risks. The following analysis provides information about the organization's risk exposure and concentration as of March 31, 2022.

Credit risk

Credit risk arises from the potential that a counter party will fail to perform its obligations. The organization is exposed to credit risk from funders, members and users. Due to the nature of the organization and its history with contributors, management assesses the credit risk as low.

5. LINE OF CREDIT

The organization has a \$10,000 line of credit with the Assiniboine Credit Union bearing interest at prime plus 1% and is secured by a general security agreement providing a fixed charge over all assets. The organization has not utilized the line of credit as at March 31, 2022.

6. DEFERRED CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS

Deferred capital contributions represent grants received from Sport Manitoba that have been deferred for the purchase of capital assets. The deferred capital contributions will be recognized into revenue over the life of the capital assets, once these capital assets are in use.

7. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED

Net assets in the amount of \$100,000 had been internally restricted by the Board of Directors for future capital acquisitions.

The \$100,000 for future capital acquisitions remains in the fund at March 31, 2022.

Future appropriations will be made, of funds considered surplus to ongoing operations, on an annual basis upon approval by the Board of Directors.

Assets have not been specifically designated and set aside for the purposes of funding this internal restriction of net assets.

8. NON-CONSOLIDATION OF CONTROLLED ENTITY

At November 30, 2021, the organization is the sole member of the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. (the "Fund"). The purpose of the Fund is to provide financial assistance to young golfers for the purpose of enabling them to further their education at a Canadian post-secondary educational institution. The Fund is incorporated under the Corporations Act of Manitoba and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act. The Fund has not been consolidated in the organization's financial statements. The financial summary of the Fund as at November 30, 2021 and for the year then ended is as follows:

During the year ended November 30, 2021, the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. made a \$37,664 (2020 - \$35,324) contribution to the Winnipeg Foundation Endowment Fund. At March 31, 2022, the market value of the contributions made to the Winnipeg Foundation was \$363,121. Any future income earned from this endowment fund will be recorded as revenue by the Manitoba Golf Scholarship Fund Inc. in the year that it occurs.

9. SIGNIFICANT INFLUENCE

The organization exercises significant influence over the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum Inc. (the "Hall of Fame") by virtue of its ability to appoint 4 of the 13 Hall of Fame's Board of Directors. The Hall of Fame was established to raise funds to acknowledge the contributions and accomplishments of Manitobans to the game of golf. The Hall of Fame is incorporated as a corporation without share capital under the laws of Manitoba and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act. Net assets of the Hall of Fame amount to \$8,139 at November 30, 2021 (2020 - \$6,942).

10. COLONELLO FOUNDATION

Beginning in the 2020 fiscal year, Golf Manitoba received new sponsorship from the Colonello Foundation. The Colonello Foundation has pledged funding to Golf Manitoba in support of developing new generations of golfers through grassroots golf initiatives and high-performance programming.

This sponsorship has also led to increases in Golf Manitoba's Teams and Public Relations & Sponsorship, and Tournament expenses as the funding from the Colonello Foundation has been used to fund golf programs throughout the province and assist junior teams with their expenses.

Golf Manitoba expects to continue their relationship with the Colonello Foundation for the foreseeable future.

11. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Included in the organization's program management expenses are operating grants of \$1,000 (2021 - \$NIL) to the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum Inc. which is related as described in Note 9.

12. NON-MONETARY TRANSACTIONS

The organization has an agreement with Nott Autocorp which allows them to use a vehicle for 5 months from Nott Autocorp. The financial statements include the full market cost for the use of the vehicle and the difference is recorded as sponsorship revenue.

The organization has a sponsorship agreement with TaylorMade which provided the organization with golf balls, hats and golf bags. The financial statements include the fair market value of the products received and the fair market value of the cost for products given out to players.

The organization has a sponsorship agreement with Adidas Canada Limited which provided the organization with golf apparel. The financial statements include the full fair market value of the products received.

13. PENSION PLAN

The organization maintains a defined contribution pension plan for most of its employees. All contributions are fully funded on a monthly basis and are included in wages and benefits expense. During the year \$8,519 (2021 - \$8,243) was recorded as an expense in relation to this pension plan.

14. CANADA EMERGENCY BUSINESS ACCOUNT LOAN

The Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) provides interest-free loans of up to \$60,000 to small businesses to help cover their operating costs during a period where their revenues have been temporarily reduced. This program has been implemented by banks and credit unions in collaboration with Export Development Canada.

Repaying the balance of the loan on or before December 31, 2022, could result in loan forgiveness of 25 percent (up to \$20,000).

Management has determined that they have appropriately spent funds in accordance with the program requirements and that the organization will repay the loan before the due date. Therefore, \$10,000 has been recognized in the current year (2021 - \$10,000), and is included in other income.

15. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

Management applied for and received funding under the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) program. This program of the Federal Government is intended to cover up to 75% of employee salaries for organizations who meet specific criteria related to decreased revenue due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the year ended March 31, 2022, the organization received \$46,371 (2021 - \$140,655) in funding related to the CEWS program.

Given the changing program criteria, and the lack of clarity regarding other aspects of the CEWS program funding, there is a potential that the organization may be required to pay back some or all of the funding received with a further potential for interest and penalties on amounts owing. The Federal Government has announced their intention to perform a significant number of audits in relation to this funding. Management has made their best efforts to apply only for funding that they believe match the criteria of the program, and to only apply for amounts related to applicable salaries.

16. SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

Reactions and restrictions to Coronavirus (COVID-19) continue to evolve and change regularly. Management of the organization continues to maintain operations where possible, while looking out for the needs and safety of their clients and employees.

Operations in the historical financial statements, as presented, do not give rise to potential going-concern issues. However, given the uncertainties on the economy, management cannot predict the effect that this will have on their future operations or cash flows.

17. COMPARATIVE FIGURES

Some of the comparative figures have been reclassified to conform to the current year's presentation.
