The 2025 season was a truly remarkable year for Golf Manitoba, marked by strong participation and record engagement across the region. Our membership is on pace to exceed 11,000 for the first time since 2014, driven by strong growth in the Public Player category. This success is mirrored by an all-time high of over 320,000 score postings, which aligns with increased momentum seen across the country. These metrics confirm golf's continued vitality and our success in fulfilling our mission to solidify golf as a game for a lifetime.

Competitively, the year delivered inspiring moments across an exceptional Championship Schedule, for which we thank our host clubs. The season we are celebrating would not be possible without their continued support of our player development initiatives. Our commitment to development and inclusion was also strong, featuring fantastic engagement in junior events (U15, Junior), the All Abilities Championship, and a growing pipeline of collegiate Alumni.

On the organizational side, we strengthened our core team and leadership. We sincerely thank outgoing President Susan-Wright Cassan for her invaluable service over the past two years and extend a warm welcome to our incoming President, Bob Peters. I want to acknowledge the retirement of valuable board members: Wayne McWhirter, who steps down after 11 years of dedicated service, and John Braun. Our operational capacity was bolstered by the arrival of two new full-time directors: Sam Beavis-Hickey (Competitions and Rules) and Sean Murray (Player Development) and interns Eryn

Our sound financial position, detailed in the 2024/25financial statements, is critical to ensuring our long-term sustainability. This stability, coupled with the essential funding provided by key partners—allows us to confidently invest in our core mission and championship programs.



COURSE RATING

The Course Rating Committee and its volunteers rated or will be rating 15 courses in full this year and completed a total of 82 tees rated. (48 men's tees and 34 women's tees). This included 7 courses in Nort Western Ontario

To maintain valid course and slope ratings, golf courses are required to be re-rated at least every 10 years or when significant changes are made.

Courses rated this year included Lake of the Sand Hills Golf Course in Buffalo Point, Players Golf Course, Shooters Golf Course, Shilo Golf and Country Club, Minnewasta Golf Club in Morden, Winkler Golf and Country Club , Killarney Golf Club, Falcon Lake Golf Course, Beauty Bay Golf Course in Kenora, Kenora Golf and Country Club, Sioux Lookout Golf Course, Whitewater Golf Course in Thunder Bay , Fort William Golf and Country Club, Centennial Pines Golf Course in Thunder Bay and Kenogamissis Golf Club in Geraldton , Ontario.

The World Handicap System was implemented in 2020 and the Rules of Handicapping and Course Rating were updated in the summer of 2024. We encourage all clubs to participate as the license agreement with the USGA requires that each club have at least one representative certified. These representatives will then be used as a resource for inquiries at the club level. If your club has not sent an individual, please do so and if you have already sent someone, we would encourage you to send others to be educated on the details of the handicap system. We would also encourage clubs to organize seminars specifically for your members and Golf Manitoba will come to your club to assist.

Thank you to all our rating volunteers for their efforts throughout the year. We are looking forward to another busy summer next year for all our men's and women's rating teams, as well as continuing to educate Manitoba and North West Ontario golfers on the parameters of the handicap system.

We added 2 new raters at the end of this rating year, so are looking forward to their participation in 2026. We continue to look for more people that would be interested in joining our rating team. We would also like to recognize Barb Hamill, who unfortunately we lost this spring, for her contribution to the ratings process for the past 30 years

MEMBERSHIP

In 2025, golf continues as an expanding activity and we continue to grow the game and increase of number of golfers playing. Golf is a game of experiences. The golf course can be a place of mental and physical health, a destination to bring friends and family together. As much as anything, golf is about community.

Individual membership increased in 2025 by 6.3% over 2024 for a total of 10,951 members. Our Public Player category also grew by over 24% to 1,624, our highest ever in this category. We had eight new clubs and off-course facilities join Golf Manitoba in 2025. We want to thank Shooters Family Golf Centre, Oakwood Golf Course, Deer Ridge Golf Course, Killarney Lakeside Golf Club, Riverdale Golf & Country Club, Heron Landing Golf Course, AVID Golf and Shanks Driving Range & Grill for joining us and extend a warm welcome to our golf family! For the complete club and league directory, please page 28.

From a golf services perspective, 2025 has been quite positive. As of September, Golf Canada reported more than 10 million rounds posted to the Score Centre and is on target to beat the all time record set in 2024. Here in Manitoba, that trend continued with 320,000 rounds posted by late-October, beating our record year of 289,000 in 2024. Golf Manitoba members used the Golf Canada App more than ever this past season with over 206,000 rounds posted in 2025 representing over 64% of all scores posted. Not only is an Official Handicap Index a requirement to play in many provincial, national and club events, it makes the game of golf more enjoyable by enabling golfers of differing abilities to compete on an equitable basis

The incident protection program also yielded 32 claims in Manitoba paying back over \$19,000 to members for equipment protection, window protection and accident protection.

The National Golf League (NGL) completed its third season in 2025. The NGL is a nations-wide season long competition created by Golf Canada to enhance the league experience for our member golfers. Bridges Golf Course was the host of this year's regional final with three teams qualifying for the national final to be played during the week of the 2026 RBC Canadian Open. Congratulations to our 2026 qualifiers!

We were also pleased to issue 69 Hole-in-One certificates to those members who made their "Shot of a Lifetime" this season. Congratulations on this exciting golfing accomplishment!

As we move into 2026, efforts will remain focused on educating both our member and non-member clubs about the benefits of a membership.

As a Provincial Association Golf Manitoba provides support for golf

services, invests in grassroots programs, develops more athletes from a position of strength and drive and deepens junior golf programming to get more kids involved in the sport.

PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Golf in Schools and Mobile Clinics

This year, our Player Development Team visited 28 schools and 26 golf courses and community centers across the province. They introduced nearly 6,500 girls and boys to the game of golf.

Junior Skills Challenge

The Junior Skills Challenge was not held this year because Golf Canada discontinued the 2025 National Championship. We will evaluate the opportunity to host a provincial championship in 2026.

Golf Manitoba Student Interns

Each season, Golf Manitoba hires, trains, and supervises two university students to run our player development programs and assist with our Provincial Championships. This year's interns were Luke and Eryn. They began their internships in late April and finished at the end of August. Both were supervised by Sean Murray for player development duties and Sam Beavis-Hickey for tournament-related duties.

Junior Player Development Teams Junior Boys

This year, 23 athletes were named to the Junior Boys Development Team roster, led by Head Coach Sean Murray. The roster was divided into two teams: the Gold Team and the Blue Team.

- Gold Team: Our highest-level golfers who represent us in Mundie Putter competitions. They receive weekly coaching from January to September.
- Blue Team: This is our feeder program for the Gold Team, made up of younger players who have shown potential or are late bloomers who need extra support to reach the next level.

Both teams trained indoors during the off-season on topics such as fitness, sport psychology, nutrition, and club selection. This year, they benefited from using the new Golf Performance Centre at Sport Manitoba. When the weather warmed up, training moved outdoors with our Spring Camp in April and the start of the Mundie Putter season. This year, our team competed in the 'A' division of the Mundie Putter league, gaining valuable experience against some of the best club players in Greater Winnipeg.

Our graduating players this year are Payne Wood, Spence Mott, Jackson Delaurier, and Liam Comaskey.

Junior Girls

With the new role of Director of Player Development, Sean Murray also became the Head Coach of the Junior Girls program, with the help of Assistant Coach Bri-Ann Tokarwski.

- The Gold Team consisted of six players—our most tournamentready female golfers in the province.
- · The Black Team had five younger players who showed great

potential.

 Coach Tokarwski also led a third Blue Team of four younger players who aspire to become future tournament competitors.

The teams spent the spring working on sport psychology, nutrition, and fitness (grip strength, endurance, and stamina). All members regularly used the new golf simulators at Sport Manitoba. In the summer, the teams transitioned to outdoor training in preparation for the tournament season. The team competed in the 'B' section of the Ladies Nassau league, reaching the semi-finals before losing to Pine Ridge in extra holes.

Our graduating players this year are Gracie McMillan, Payton Oakden, & Emily Devlin.

Canada Summer Games

Golf returned to the Canada Summer Games from August 19–22 in St. John's, Newfoundland. The team's qualifiers were determined through a season-long process, which included the best six of eight rounds from the Manitoba Match Play Qualifier, Nex Gen Prairies, and the Manitoba Junior Championships. The qualifiers were Payne Wood, Spence Mott, Camryn Thomas, and Maisy Shewchuk. Payne later dropped out and was replaced by Brayden Boge.

Manitoba placed 7th in the team competition. Spence Mott came in 4th in the individual competition, missing a medal by one stroke.

Individual and Team Highlights

Our team members won almost every MJT event in all categories.

- · Manitoba Junior Champion: Spence Mott
- Manitoba U15 Champions: Hunter Oakden and Angelina Sitarz For the first time in more than four years, all three boys representing the interprovincial team came from our Gold Team.

We would like to thank the management and members of the Elmhurst Golf & Country Club, St Charles Country Club and the Southwood Golf & Country Club for hosting our junior girls' and boys' practices all season long. Your support of our Team Manitoba program is deeply appreciated.



TOURNAMENT &

OFFICIALS

Throughout 2025, we were laying the groundwork to bring the Tournament and Officials Committees together. The merger remains a work in progress, but its purpose is clear, to strengthen coordination across all Golf Manitoba championships. The steps taken this year should help build a more connected and efficient approach in the seasons ahead.

Season Overview

The 2025 competitive season once again showcased the depth of talent, dedication, and sportsmanship within the Golf Manitoba community. Across Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario, golfers of all ages demonstrated passion for the game and pride in representing their clubs and region.

Host Clubs

Over the course of the season, Golf Manitoba conducted 15 championships at 11 host venues. In total, 1,787 competitive rounds were played by 970 participants, reflecting excellent growth and enthusiasm for competitive golf in our region.

Officiating and Operations

This past year was a productive one, marked by strong participation in rules education, on course refereeing, and collaborative planning for future championships. We welcomed new Director of Tournament and Rules, Sam Beavis-Hickey and worked closely with him to establish Notice to Competitors and mark courses. We were again supported by Amy with scoring, Brian with communication, Golf

Manitoba Interns, Luke and Eryn, and Executive Director Jared. Our appreciation extends to our referees & other volunteers for their countless hours of service; their professionalism and commitment ensures that every Golf Manitoba championship is conducted to the highest standard.

Rules education and official development remained a key focus. Over the winter, multiple Rules of Golf seminars were hosted virtually by Rob Bell, Don MacDonald, and Gord Hudson, drawing more than 120 participants. In April, 18 officials attended the Level 2 Provincial Certification Seminar, with most writing the exam. This reflects a continued commitment to developing qualified officials within the province. During the season, three new referees finished their ride-along mentorships, expanding our roster of certified officials for future years.

Golf Canada hosted a three-day Referee School at Niakwa Country Club, providing valuable professional development opportunities. Additionally, efforts are being made to work directly with athletes on the High-Performance Teams, offering rules education tailored to competitive play.

New spectator signage outlining on-course expectations was introduced at all events to help referees manage interactions and promote fair play. Looking ahead, the committee is exploring off-season training opportunities to help officials develop further in their roles.

Supporting Junior Golf

Supporting the next generation of golfers remains a cornerstone of Golf Manitoba's mission. In 2025, entry fees for junior events continued to be maintained at accessible levels, and travel assistance was provided to juniors who qualified for national championships. These initiatives were made possible through the continued generosity of the Alex & Peggy Colonello Foundation, whose investment in junior golf development remains vital to our programs.

REPORT OF THE

TREASURER

Golf Manitoba (GM) remains in a strong financial position for the fiscal year ended March 31, 2025, thanks to the support of our Member Clubs and Membership and the support of Sport Manitoba and our Sponsors.

Thank you to the Peggy and Alex Colonello Foundation for their significant contribution to support the development of new generations of golfers through grassroots golf initiatives and highperformance programming.

Special thank you as well to the many volunteers who give freely of their time in support of amateur golf.

Key Highlights:

Financial Performance (2025)

Revenue: \$877,864 up from \$783,223 previous year (+\$94,6451)

The increase in revenue was largely driven by membership dues and camp and clinic fees offset by a decrease in tournament entry fees.

GM continues to see an increase of public player members.

Expenses rose modestly from the previous year largely due to program management and sport development.

The Finance Committee maintains a diversified investment strategy to support long-term stability and reduce dependency on membership dues. GICs are invested with RBC Dominion Securities Inc. Interest rates range from 3.46% to 5.5% and maturity dates range from May 2, 2025 to October 16, 2029.

Governance & Audit

The audited statements included as part of the 2025 Annual Report were prepared by the Exchange Chartered Professional Accountants. The Auditors have issued an unqualified opinion, confirming the statements are free of material error and compliant with Canadian Standards for Nonprofits.

GM continues to manage funds responsibly with oversight from Finance Committee and the Board of Directors guided by the GM Financial Policy and by-laws and the budget adopted, while continuing to support the mission of promoting and organizing amateur golf in Manitoba and NW Ontario.

Thank you to Golf Manitoba Staff, Finance Committee and Board Members for their participation in the process.

GOLF MANITOBA SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund's mandate is to provide scholarships to student golfers for the advancement of their education at a Canadian post-secondary educational institution through the receipt, investment, accumulation, and disbursement of funds for that purpose. Scholarships are awarded to golfers who submit applications which meet established criteria for academic achievement, community involvement and golfing ability. Since 1986, the Scholarship Fund has awarded over 230 scholarships, totaling more than \$250,000 to student golfers throughout Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario.

The Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund Inc.endowment fund (the "Fund") continues to be managed by the Winnipeg Foundation. As at September 30, 2024 the market value of the Fund grew to \$432 365. The Scholarship Fund has already benefited significantly from this process in the form of matching funds and increasing yield on the financial assets held with The Winnipeg Foundation. This has allowed for an increased number and value of scholarships being able to be awarded -- in 2024, 11 scholarships totaling \$17,500 were available for disbursement.

The Scholarship Fund has a number of scholarships named in honour of individuals that have specific criteria. In addition, there are several Golf Manitoba general awards available:

The Dr. Dwight Parkinson scholarship is awarded to the secondary school graduate with the highest academic achievement who will be pursuing a post-secondary education. The scholarship was established on a perpetual basis from a generous donation received from Mr. David Hill.

The Brian Gilhuly Memorial Award is presented to a candidate demonstrating superior scholastic achievement who is continuing their academic career. This scholarship was funded on a perpetual basis due to a generous endowment from Brian Gilhuly's estate.

The Craig Yahiro Memorial Scholarship is two awards, one to a woman and one to a man, who are entering or continuing with post-secondary studies and who are either Golf Manitoba members or who are currently involved with golf either through employment or participation. This scholarship is funded through the generosity of the Yahiro Family and an annual fundraising event held at Rossmere Country Club.

The Ed Dearden Memorial Scholarship was established for 2024 due to the generous donations of family and friends. The award is available to students who are entering of continuing with post secondary studies. Ed served for many years of the committee of

Manitoba Golfer of the Year and was inducted into the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame in 2007.



It is with great pleasure that we recognize Harvey & Marion Goehring with the 2024 volunteer Distinguished Service Award.




On behalf of Selection Committee members Clayton Dreger, Jill Hardy, Adam Speirs and Ken Wiebe, Golf Manitoba is pleased to recognize the 2024 Amateur Golfer of the Year Award winners.

The 2024 recipients were announced on October 29, 2024, at the annual Golf Manitoba Awards presented by AVID GOLF that was held at the St. Charles Country Club.

Addison Kartusch of St. Charles Country Club is the 2024 Female Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Kartusch, 18, from Winnipeg, won the Match Play Championship presented by St. Vital Dental Centre, the Diamond Athletic Women's Amateur Championship and the Junior Girls Championship presented by the Alex & Peggy Colonello Foundation. The St. Charles Country Club member also finished T3 at the Canadian Junior Girls Championship and T48 at the Canadian Women's Amateur Championship.

According to available records, Kartusch is the first golfer in Manitoba history to win the Women's Match Play Championship, Women's Amateur Championship and Junior Girls Championship in the same season.



With the selection, it is the first time that Kartusch has been recognized as Female Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Braxton Kuntz of Breezy Bend Country Club is the 2024 Male Amateur Golfer of the Year.

Kuntz, 20, from Winnipeg, won the Nott Autocorp Men's Amateur Championship and was T2 on the leaderboard at the Elmhurst Invitational. The Breezy Bend Country Club member finished T3 at the Canadian Men's Amateur Championship, the NCAA Bryan National Collegiate Championship and at the NCAA Butler University Don Benbow Invitational. He also placed T12 at the NCAA Fighting Illini Spring Collegiate Championship.

Kuntz is the first player in Manitoba history to win the Men's Amateur Championship in four consecutive years (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024) surpassing the previous record of three consecutive years held by Todd Fanning (1990, 1991, 1992) and R.J Reith (1935, 1936, 1937). He was also the first player to win both the Junior Boys Championship and Men's Amateur Championship in back-to-back seasons (2021 and 2022).

With the selection, it is the fourth time in as many years that Kuntz has been named Male Amateur Golfer of the Year (2021, 2022, 2023, 2024).as been named Male Amateur Golfer of the Year (2021, 2022, 2023).

The Committee also considers, for review and approval by the Board, the engagement or re-appointment of the external auditors.

Opinion

DESCRIPTION OF ORGANIZATION

Golf Manitoba Inc. (the "organization") is a non-profit organization established to develop, promote, govern and service the game of golf in Manitoba and North West Ontario for the benefit of all participants.

The organization is exempt from taxation as a non-profit entity under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for not-for-profit organizations. Because a precise determination of many assets and liabilities is dependent upon future events, the preparation of financial statements for a period necessarily involves the use of estimates which have been made using careful judgement. The financial statements have, in management's opinion, been properly prepared within the reasonable limits of materiality and within the framework of the significant accounting policies summarized below:

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are recorded at fair value when acquired or issued. In subsequent periods, financial assets with actively traded markets are reported at fair value, with any unrealized gains and losses reported in income. All other financial instruments are reported at amortized cost, and tested for impairment at each reporting date. Transaction costs on the acquisition, sale, or issue of financial instruments are expensed when incurred.

Investments

Investments, which consist of guaranteed investment certificates with original maturities at date of purchase beyond three months, are carried at amortized cost.

Inventory

Inventory is recorded at cost and consists of rule books, pins and clothing.

Capital assets

Capital assets are stated at cost or deemed cost less accumulated amortization. Capital assets are amortized over their estimated useful lives on a straight-line basis at the following rates:

Computer software	4 years
Golf Studio	4 years
Computer equipment	3 to 5 years
Office furniture	2 to 4 years
Tournament equipment	3 to 5 years

The organization regularly reviews its capital assets to eliminate obsolete items.

Deferred capital contributions

Deferred capital contributions represent contributions received which are restricted for the purchase of capital assets. The deferred amounts are recognized into revenue at the same rate of amortization as the related acquired capital assets.

2. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Revenue recognition

The organization follows the deferral method of accounting for grants from funders. Externally restricted grants are recognized as revenue in the year in which the related expenses are recognized. Unrestricted grants, membership dues, camp and clinic fees are recognized as revenue when received or receivable if the amount to be received can be reasonably estimated and collection is reasonably assured.

Donated services

A large number of volunteers donate significant amounts of their time to program events and fundraising activities. No amount has been reflected in the financial statements for donated services since an objective basis is not available to measure the value of such services.

Allocation of salaries and wages and office expenses

The organization allocates salary and wage, and office expenses to three functional areas: administration, program management and tournament. The percentages are based upon estimates of staff time and resources spent for each area. These percentages are reviewed every year to determine whether there has been any significant shift which might warrant a change to the allocations.

3. FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The organization is exposed to various risks through its financial instruments and has a comprehensive risk management framework to monitor, evaluate and manage these risks. The following analysis provides information about the organization's risk exposure and concentration.

Credit risk

Credit risk arises from the potential that a counter party will fail to perform its obligations. The organization is exposed to credit risk from funders, members and users. Due to the nature of the organization and its history with contributors, management assesses the credit risk as low.

4. INVESTMENTS

Investments consist of guaranteed investment certificates held at RBC Dominion Securities Inc. Interest rates on the GIC's range from 3.46% to 5.50% and maturity dates range from May 2, 2025 to October 16, 2029.

6. LINE OF CREDIT

The organization has a \$10,000 line of credit with the Assiniboine Credit Union bearing interest at prime plus 1.00% and is secured by a general security agreement providing a fixed charge over all assets. The organization has not utilized the line of credit as at March 31, 2025.

7. DEFERRED CAPITAL CONTRIBUTIONS

Deferred capital contributions represent grants received from Sport Manitoba that have been deferred for the purchase of capital assets. The deferred capital contributions will be recognized into revenue over the life of the capital assets, once these capital assets are in use.

8. INTERNALLY RESTRICTED

Net assets in the amount of \$100,000 had been internally restricted by the Board of Directors for future capital acquisitions.

The \$100,000 for future capital acquisitions remains in the fund at March 31, 2025.

Future appropriations will be made, of funds considered surplus to ongoing operations, on an annual basis upon approval by the Board of Directors.

Assets have not been specifically designated and set aside for the purposes of funding this internal restriction of net assets.

NON-CONSOLIDATION OF CONTROLLED ENTITY

At November 30, 2022, the organization is the sole member of the Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund Inc. (the "Fund"). The purpose of the Fund is to provide financial assistance to young golfers for the purpose of enabling them to further their education at a Canadian post-secondary educational institution. The Fund is incorporated under the Corporations Act of Manitoba and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act. The Fund has not been consolidated in the organization's financial statements. The financial summary of the Fund for the year then ended is as follows:

During the year ended November 30, 2024, the Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund Inc. made a \$575 (2023 - \$6,001) contribution to the Winnipeg Foundation Endowment Fund. At March 31, 2025, the market value of the contributions made to the Winnipeg Foundation was \$424,367 (2024 - \$406,628). Any future income earned from this endowment fund will be recorded as revenue by the Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund Inc. in the year that it occurs.

10. SIGNIFICANT INFLUENCE

The organization exercises significant influence over the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum Inc. (the "Hall of Fame") by virtue of its ability to appoint 4 of the 13 Hall of Fame's Board of Directors. The Hall of Fame was established to raise funds to acknowledge the contributions and accomplishments of Manitobans to the game of golf. The Hall of Fame is incorporated as a corporation without share capital under the laws of Manitoba and is a registered charity under the Income Tax Act. Net assets of the Hall of Fame amount to \$4,980 at November 30, 2024 (2023 - \$7,543).

11. THE ALEX AND PEGGY COLONELLO FOUNDATION

Beginning in the 2020 fiscal year, Golf Manitoba received new sponsorship from the Alex and Peggy Colonello Foundation. The Alex and Peggy Colonello Foundation has pledged funding to Golf Manitoba in support of developing new generations of golfers through grassroots golf initiatives and high-performance programming.

This sponsorship has also led to increases in Golf Manitoba's teams, marketing and promotion, golf community sponsorships and overall tournament expenses as the funding from the Alex and Peggy Colonello Foundation has been used to fund golf programs throughout the province and assist junior teams with their expenses.

Golf Manitoba expects to continue their relationship with the Alex and Peggy Colonello Foundation for the foreseeable future.

12. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Included in the organization's program management expenses are operating grants of \$1,000 to the Manitoba Golf Hall of Fame and Museum Inc. and \$250 to the Golf Manitoba Scholarship Fund Inc. which are related parties as described in Notes 9 and 10.

13. NON-MONETARY TRANSACTIONS

The organization has an agreement with Nott Autocorp which allows them to use a vehicle for 5 months from Nott Autocorp. The financial statements include the full market cost for the use of the vehicle and the difference is recorded as sponsorship revenue.

The organization has a sponsorship agreement with Cobra Puma Golf Inc. which provided the organization with golf apparel. The financial statements include the fair market value of the products received and the fair market value of the cost for products given out to players.

For the year ended March 31, 2024 in-kind contributions recorded in sponsorship revenue totaled \$20,105 (2024 - \$25,675).

14. PENSION PLAN

The organization maintains a defined contribution pension plan for most of its employees. All contributions are fully funded on a monthly basis and are included in wages and benefits expense. During the year \$10,531 (2024 - \$6,898) was recorded as an expense in relation to this pension plan.
