



CODE OF CONDUCT FOR PARENTS, GUARDIANS, AND SPECTATORS POLICY

Spectators are ALWAYS WELCOME and ENCOURAGED to attend all Golf Manitoba championships!

Golf Manitoba takes great pride in the quality of its competitions, host facilities and broad community involvement at each competition. To continue making Golf Manitoba competitions enjoyable for everyone, and to show respect for the involvement of our host facilities and their volunteers, Golf Manitoba requires that all parents and spectators adhere to this Code of Conduct for Parents, Guardians and Spectators and all Safe Sport Policies at all Golf Manitoba competitions:

- Help your junior competitors learn the Rules of Golf including golf etiquette and respect for fellow competitors.
- Respect all Golf Manitoba volunteers, staff, spectators, and Golf Manitoba property.
- Respect the host club, their personnel, volunteers, and property. Each club has their own dress code and cell phone policy, please familiarize yourself with it.
- Refrain from objectionable behavior including unacceptable language, disrespect to other players, referees, other spectators, and volunteers.

Minimum Distance and Prohibited Areas

- A minimum of 30 yards must be maintained between the player and all spectators in all circumstances with the following exceptions:
 - once all players have reached the green spectators must remain 10 yards from the green
 - once all players are on the tee, spectators must remain 10 yards from the tee
- When cart paths are provided, spectators must stay on those paths. When no cart paths are provided spectators must walk in the outside rough.
- Spectators are prohibited from the following areas:
 - tees, fairways & greens
 - scoring and starting areas
 - rules situations

Communication

- Please refrain from giving advice to any player during the entire competition. Advice is defined as counsel or suggestion that could influence a player in determining their play, choice of club or method of making a stroke.
- Please avoid all communication, verbal and non - verbal, which may be construed by others as advice.
- Allow only referees to administer rulings and do not intervene. You will be brought into a situation ONLY if the referee asks you.
- **The competitor will be given a General Penalty under Rule 10.2a** if prohibited communication is given, whether asked for or not.



With the following exceptions:

- Asking or giving the player food, drink, umbrella, or rain suit.
- Need to deal with a medical situation.

Lost Golf Balls

- Spectators are permitted to help search for a player's golf ball with permission from said player.
- You are welcome to tell a referee where you believe the point of entry into a penalty area is or the general area where a ball may be located ONLY if asked by that referee.

Golf Carts

- Spectator carts are permitted with a valid medical reason or at the discretion of the host venue and/or tournament committee, and fees will apply. You must follow the minimum distance and prohibited areas rules above. Violators will be asked to leave, and carts will be removed.

Safe Sport

Golf Manitoba is aligned with Golf Canada and Respect Group in committing to fostering a safe sport environment for golf.

All golfers deserve to participate and compete in an environment free from bullying, abuse, harassment or discrimination, regardless of gender identity or expression, race, religion, language, age and ability.

- All players 18 and under must have at least one (1) parent complete the Respect in Sport "Parent Program" no later than the deadline of the tournament they wish to enter. Events include the Bantam Championship and the Provincial Junior Championship.

Penalties for breach of Parent/Spectator Code of Conduct

- 1st breach: warning to both player and spectator or General Penalty to the player being followed.
- 2nd breach: if the communication is determined to be "advice" (by definition) = General Penalty to the player being followed. Any direction, interference, discipline, scolding, influence, other than "advice" (as defined) or breach of any of the above-mentioned rules = one-stroke penalty to the player being followed.
- 3rd breach: Disqualification - regardless of the type of breach
